



FIREWOOD

DESCRIPTION AND DRYING/STORAGE INSTRUCTIONS

Quick Overview

Firewood is reprocessed 12 months of the year and available as split logs. It is highly recommended to be stored throughout the Summer period. Stock is currently Hardwood. Firewood is supplied in full loads only and based on a 3.5 m³ loading bucket. Delivered as a tipper load. Please note, stock is unseasoned and stored outside.

How to Dry wet firewood:

- Seasoning is the process of naturally air drying the wood until it has reached a low enough moisture level for it to burn effectively.
- Stack the firewood in a row in an area that benefits from the wind and sun. Keep the stack of seasoning firewood off any moist ground and located under a suitable form of cover, if located in a wetter area.
- Keep the wood off any wet ground on either a dry platform or raised up on treated timber/bearers.
- Stack the firewood in a single row leaving enough of a gap between the logs to allow for airflow.
- Keep at least one side of the stack completely open to air flow.
- Firewood located in an open, dry area outside, and off the ground and with sufficient cover will dry faster than firewood that is not properly exposed to the wind and sheltered from further contact with moisture.
